

NEW BUGGY SPRING.—One day this week our attention was called to a new style buggy spring, just patented by Messrs. Thrush, Perlett & Stough, carriage builders, of this place. These springs are known by the name of side bar springs, and consist of two wooden bars connecting the fore and rear axles, to which flat two-ply springs are attached near each end, upon which the buggy rests, so that the motion given to the body when crossing uneven places in the roadway is very pleasant to that compared with carriages hung upon the elliptic spring. The lateral motion, so common in the old-style spring is entirely unnoticeable, but a pleasant undulating motion is experienced, creating an agreeable sensation to the occupants. This style of spring is coming into general use, and we feel certain that this enterprising firm will reap considerable benefit from this excellent improvement. Quite a number of our citizens have given their orders for carriages built with this improvement, thus testifying to its excellence.
